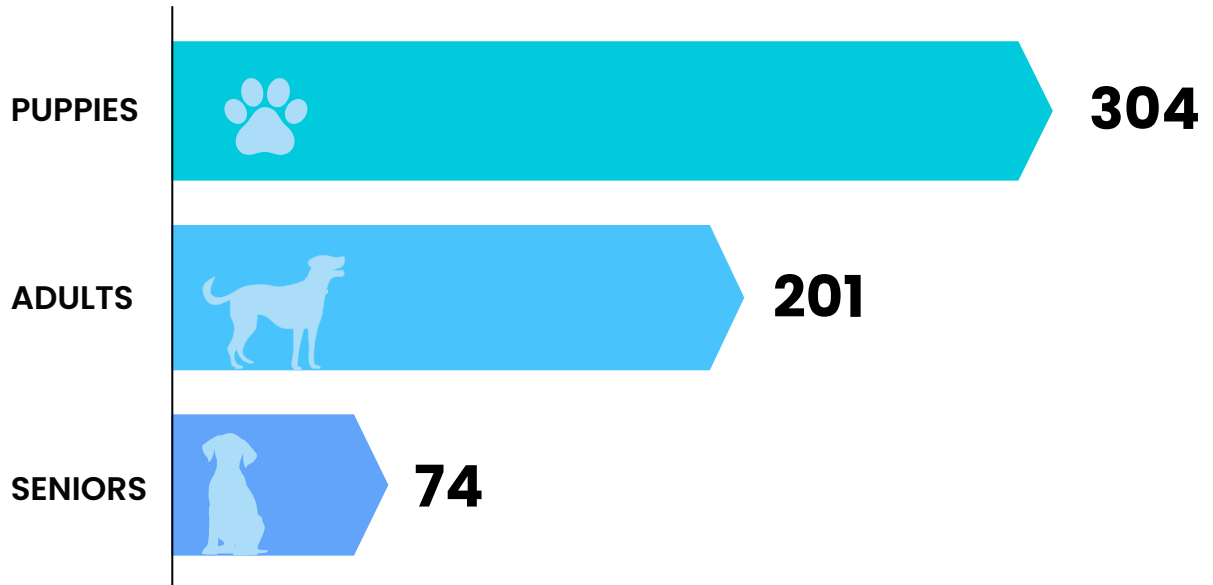

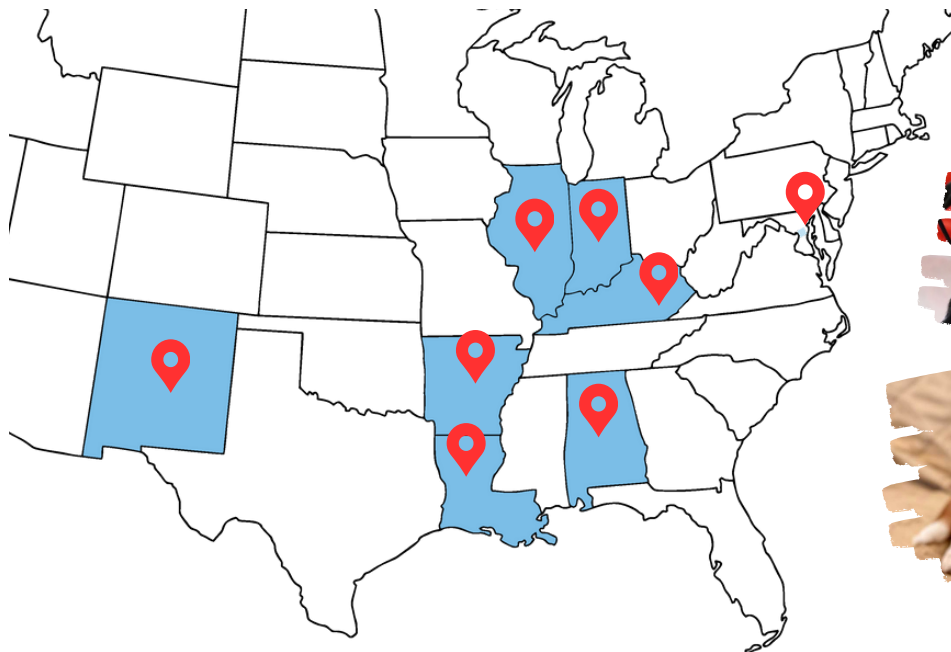

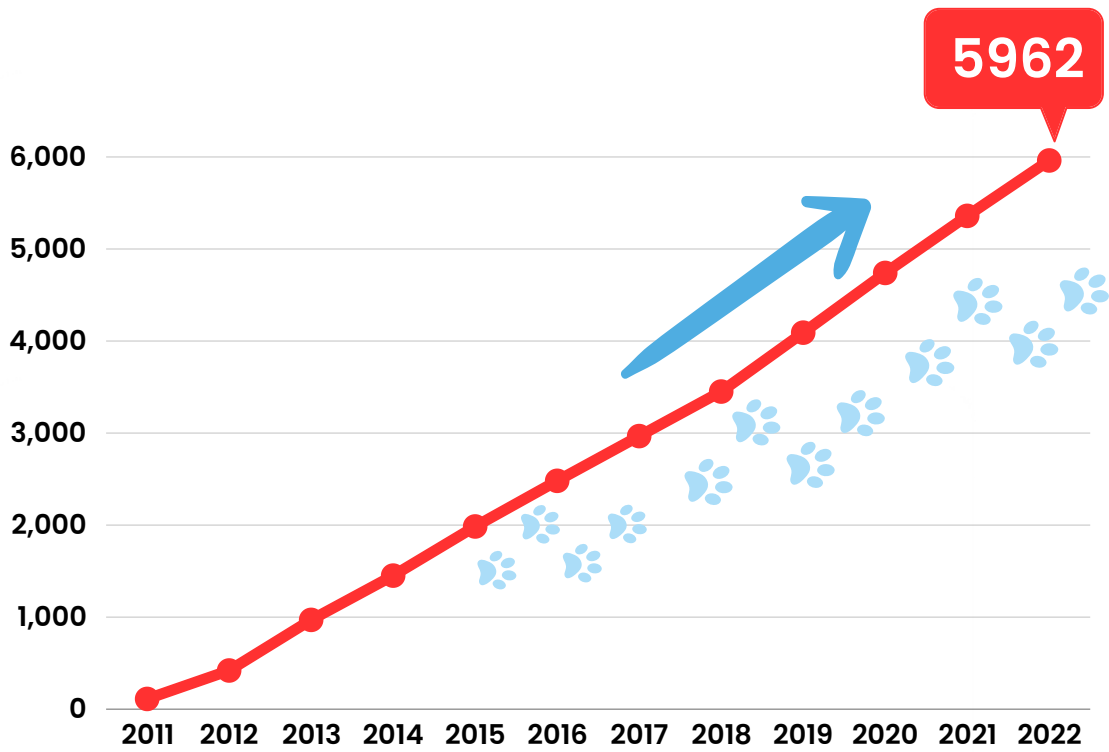

Francisco

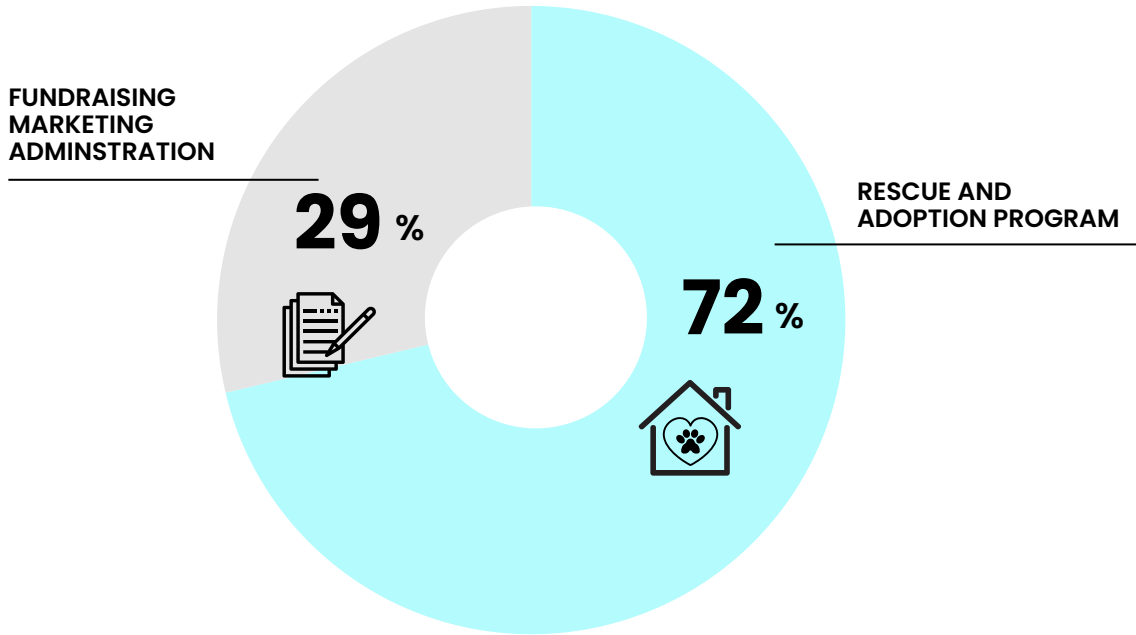

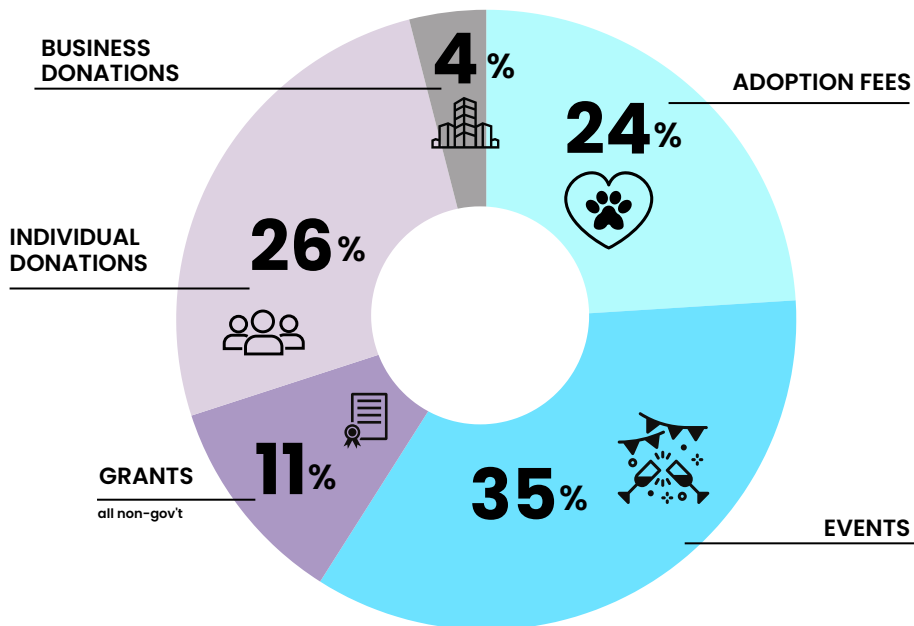

SCCR EXPENSES

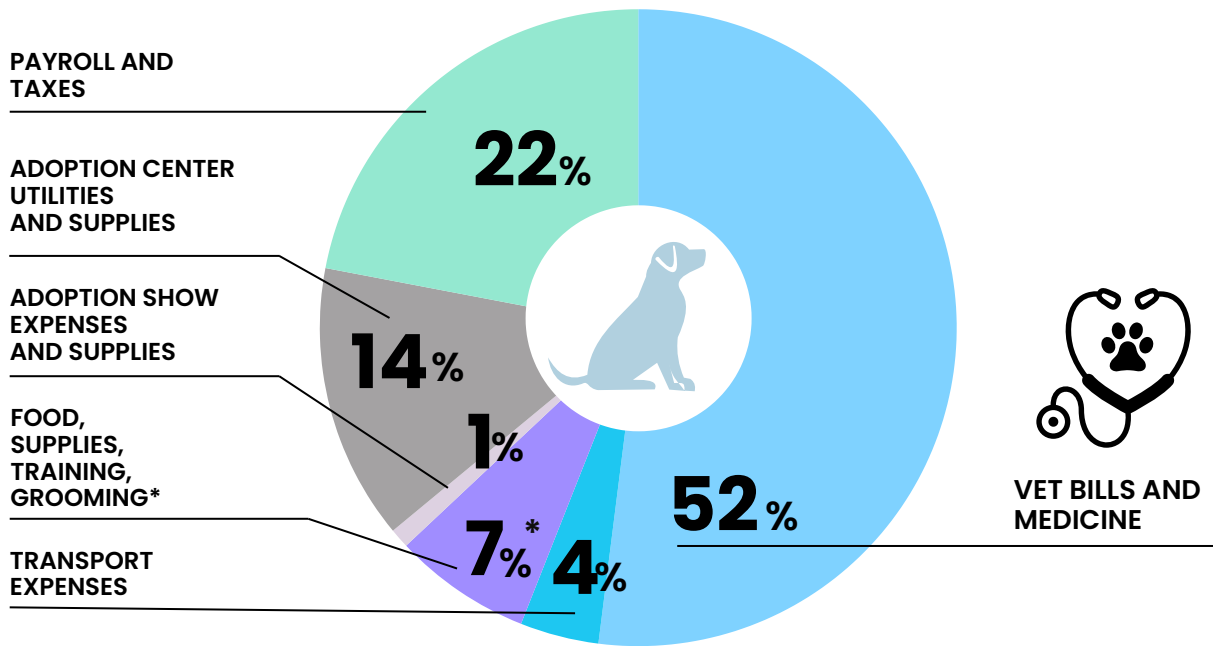


SCCR INCOME



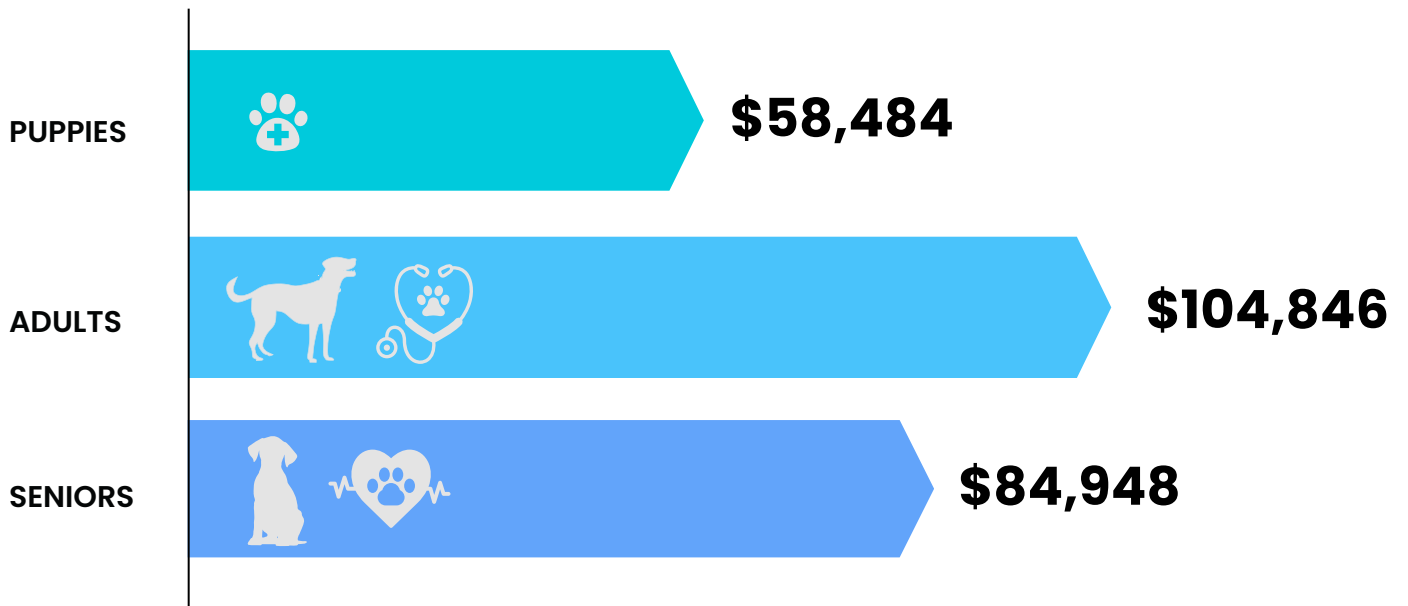

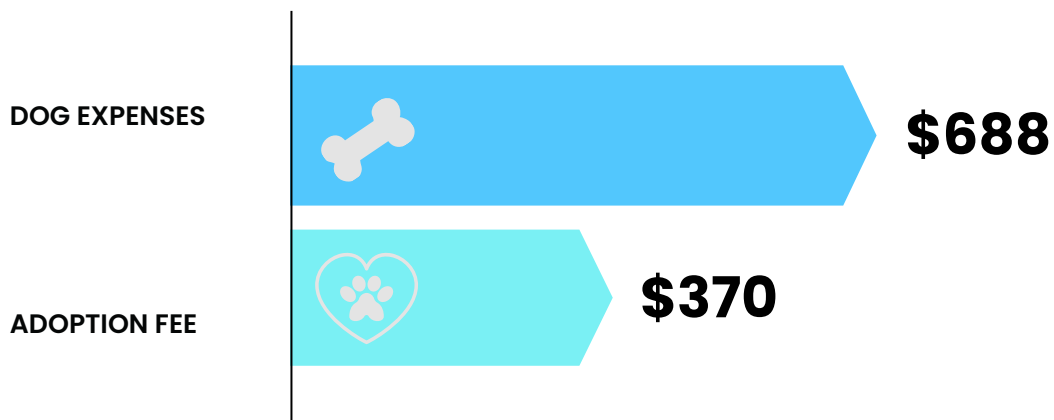

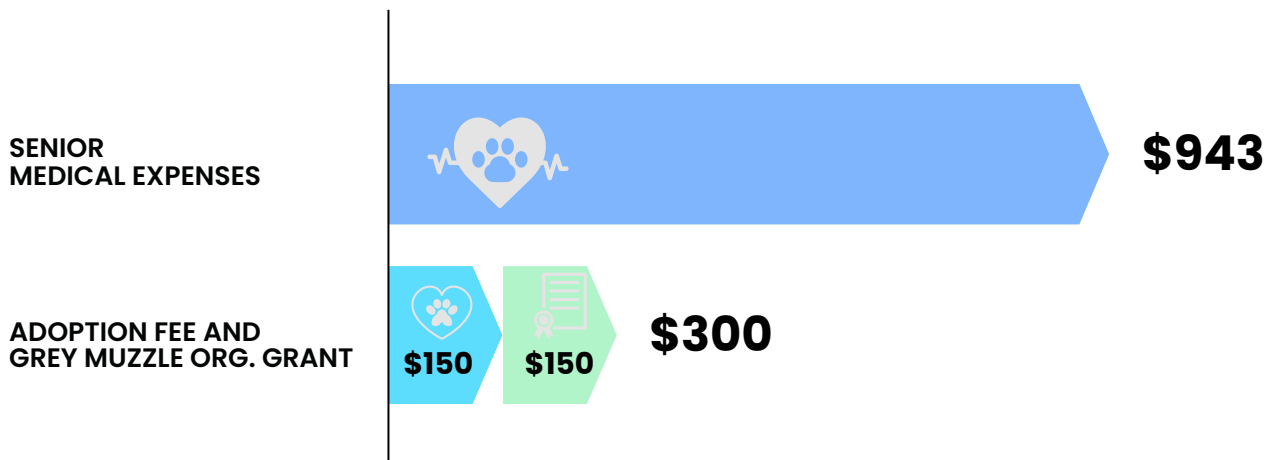
We believe in the importance of accessibility—
